Guidelines for Contributors

April 1989

Atlantis is an interdisciplinary academic journal devoted to research in Women's Studies, and critical or creative writing, in English or French, on the topic of women. The Editoral Board welcomes manuscripts embodying all viewpoints on Women's Studies. Also considered for inclusion are book and film reviews, as well as short stories of not more than 1,500 words; photography, and slides, preferably in black and white; appropriate artwork, preferably in black and white; and poetry submissions of not more than five pages. All contributors are expected to provide a biographical note of approximately twenty-five words at the time their work is accepted for publication.

Articles should be prepared in the MLA or APA format. Submissions should be no more than 10,000 typed words, double spaced. Manuscripts should be written in nonsexist language, and copy should be clean and proofed. Authors are responsible for the accuracy of all footnotes and references; and manuscripts will not be considered for publication unless all footnotes and references are complete. Four copies of each submission are to be included, three of which should be prepared for blind review, accompanied by a cover sheet indicating title, author(s), affiliation(s), and mailing address(es). If a manuscript is accepted for publication, the author must immediately provide an abstract of not more than one hundred words in both English and French, plus a biographical note of the first author of approximately twenty-five words.

Atlantis is a nonprofit academic journal, published twice a year (number 1 in fall and number 2 in spring), supported by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada and by subscription fees. Atlantis retains First North American Rights. Contributors (first authors only) receive either an offprint of their contribution or a complimentary copy of the issue in which their work appears, depending on which is available at the time of publication.

À l'intention des collaboratrices

Atlantis est une revue académique interdisciplinaire qui se consacre à la recherche dans le domaine des études sur la femme et à la publication de travaux critiques ou de création sur le sujet des femmes. Le Comité de rédaction accueille tout manuscrit qui exprime un point de vue ayant trait aux études sur la femme. Il accepte également de considérer les comptes rendus de livres et de films, ainsi que les nouvelles ne dépassant pas 1,500 mots, les photographies, les diapositives et autres réalisations artistiques, de préférence en noir et blanc, de même que les oeuvres de poésie ne dépassant pas cinq pages. Les articles et les travaux de création sont publiés en anglais ou en français.

Les articles doivent être présentés suivant les normes de la MLA ou de l'APA. Les manuscrits, dactylographiées à double interligne, devraient être nets et avoir été relus avant d'être soumis. Ils ne devraient pas dépasser les 10,000 mots. Les auteures sont responsables de l'exactitude des notes et des ouvrages cités en référence; seuls seront considérés en vue de publication les manuscrits accompagnés de notes et de références complètes. Prière d'envoyer quatre exemplaires, dont trois non identifiés pour évaluation, accompagnés d'une page de couverture indépendante portant les renseignements suivants: titre, auteure(s), affiliation(s), adresse(s) postale(s).

Lorsque son manuscrit aura été accepté, l'auteure enverra une notice biographique d'environ vingt-cinq mots, ainsi qu'un résumé d'un centaine de mots en anglais et en français.
