GUIDELINES FOR ACTIVITIES

1. Women's concerns and perspectives should be the focus of all Forum activities.
2. Respect for one another's experience and views, openness and a spirit of co-operation should be the guiding principles.
3. Finding common ground for action even in diversity of opinions should be the principal aim.
4. All introductions should be designed to provide a clear focus in the shortest time possible and stimulate discussion.
5. The major portion of time in an activity should be given to discussion. Each participant should have the opportunity to express her views.
6. Each participant should co-operate by arriving on time, remaining throughout the session and listening to the views of others.
7. The workshop leaders have the responsibility to ensure that the foregoing guidelines are followed. If at any time this should prove impossible, the leader may call for a pause to negotiate or formally to close the session.

Note: Whispered translation should be arranged by workshop leaders for sessions, if required.
